

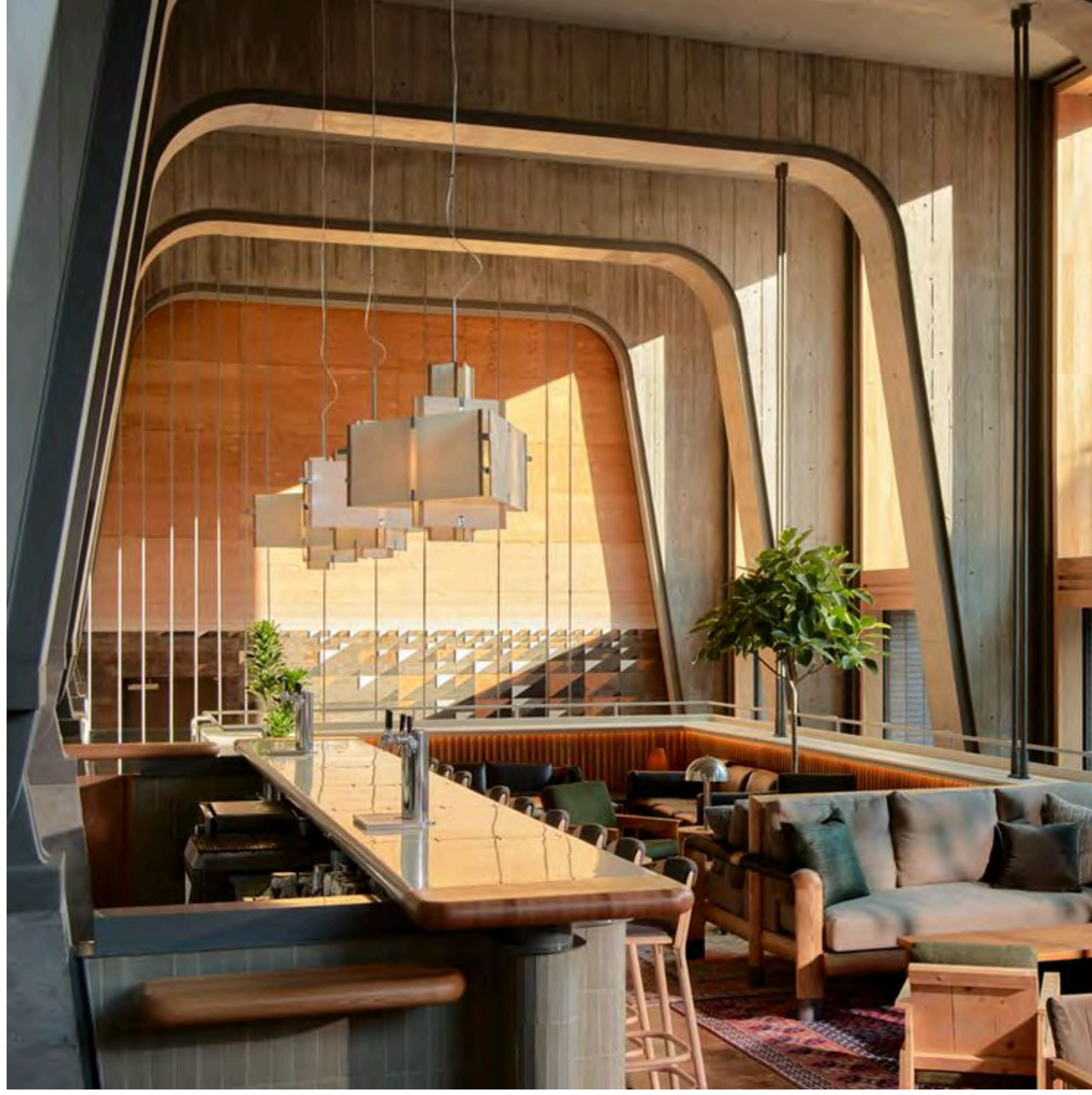

ACE HOTEL TORONTO

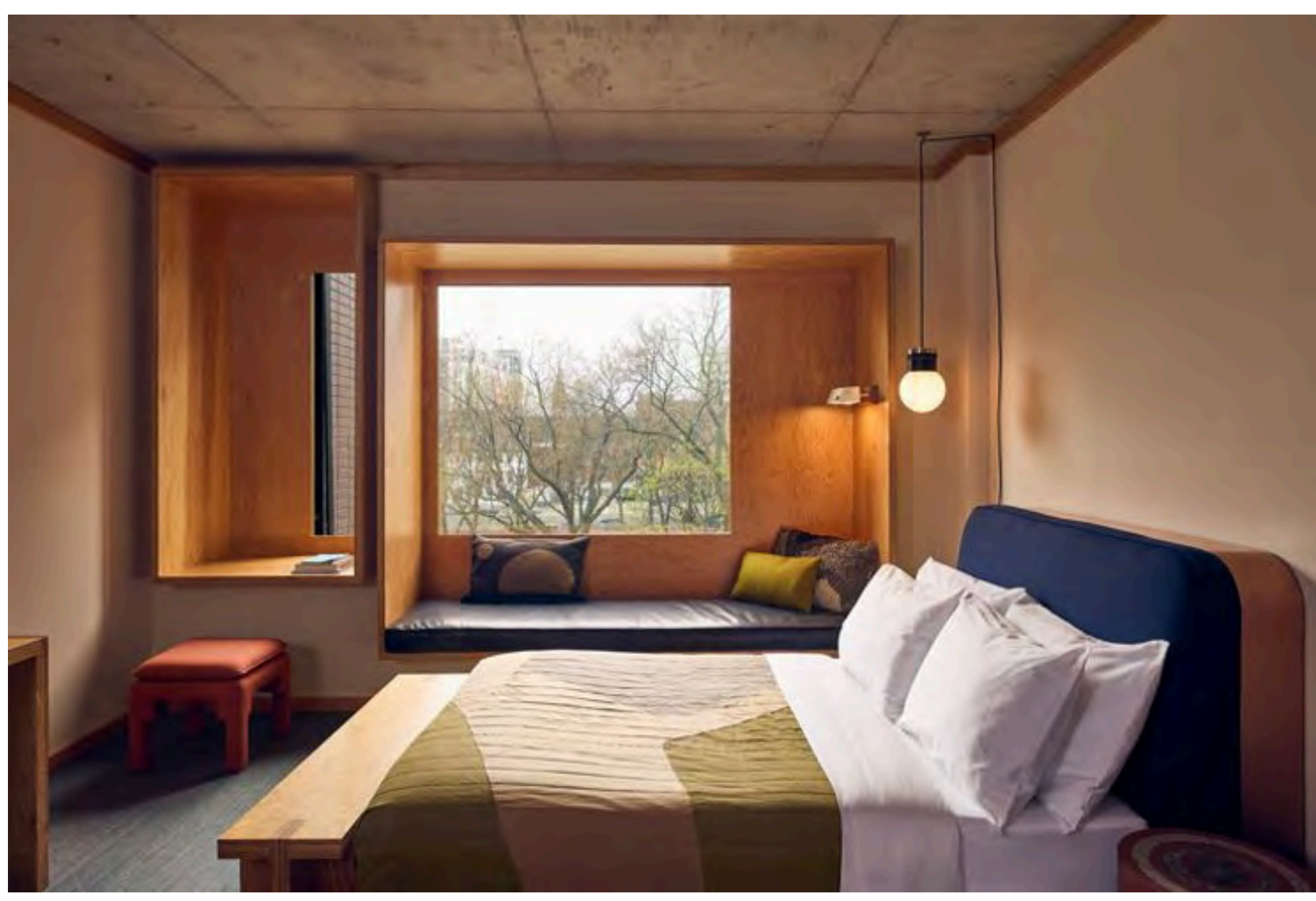

CLAYOQUOT WILDERNESS LODGE

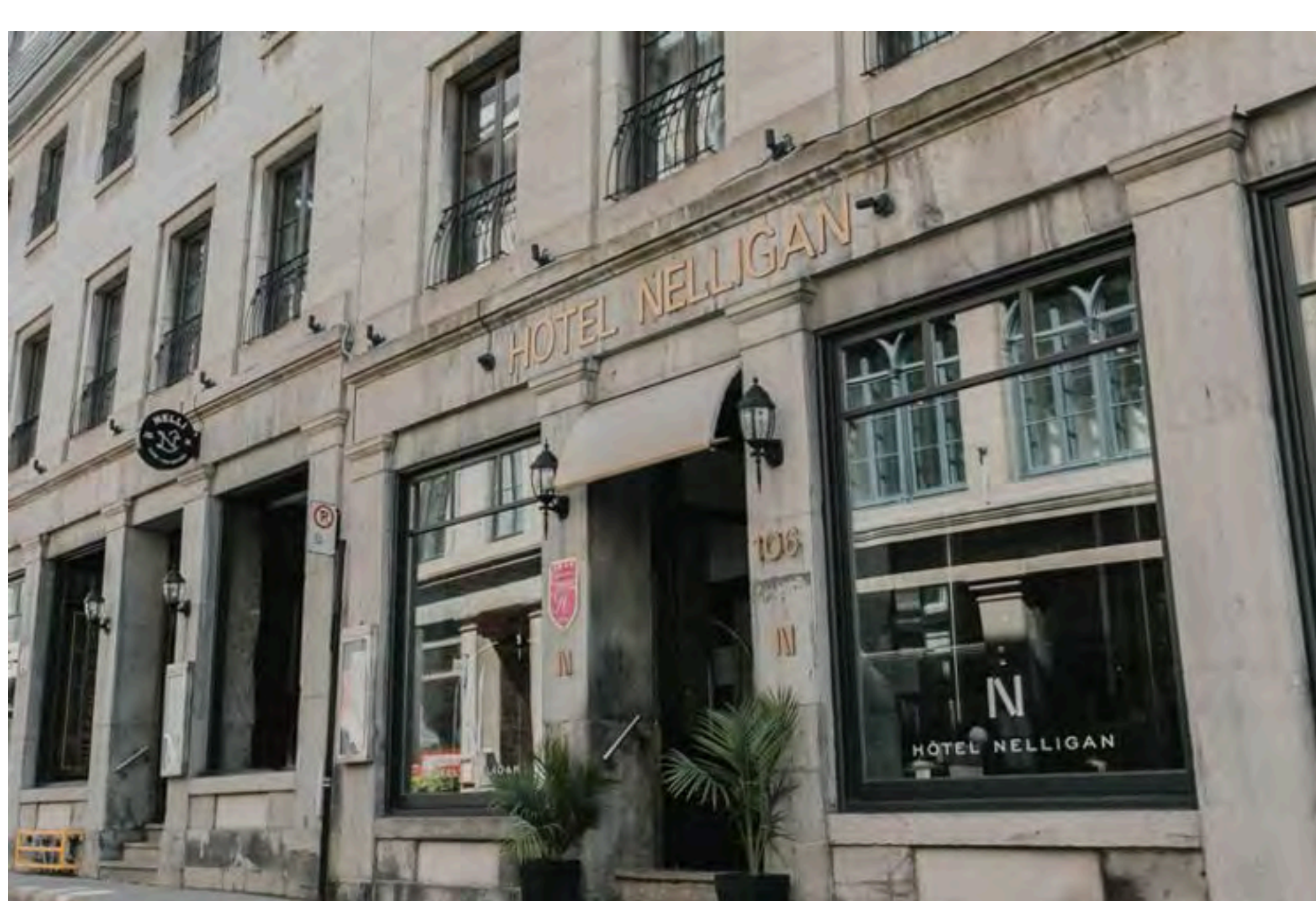
2. Clayoquot Wilderness Lodge in BC

CLAYOQUOT WILDERNESS LODGE

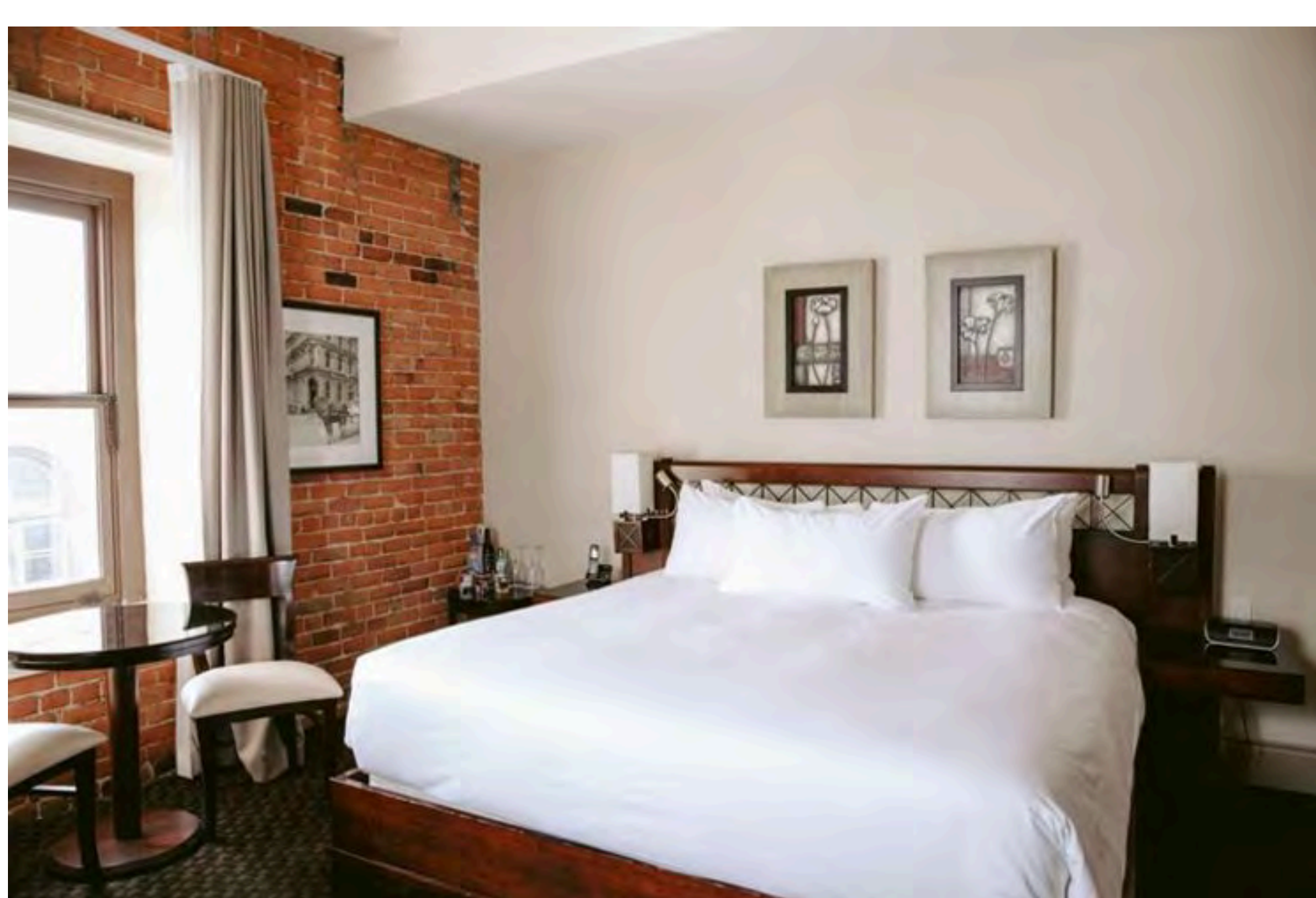
